

Equity Update since November 2022

OSSTF/FEESO continues to be engaged in several activities as per the Action Plan to Support Equity, Anti-Racism, and Anti-Oppression. A few of the completed and ongoing actions are found below.

- In January 2023, Members were selected to join the OSSTF/FEESO writing team to develop resources for Bargaining Unit Equity, Anti-Racism and Anti-Oppression Officers.
- OSSTF/FEESO provided a sponsorship contribution to <u>Harmony Movement</u> for their upcoming <u>Educator's Anti-Racism Conference</u> on February 15, 2023.
- In December 2022, The Addressing Anti-Black Racism/Racism Committee hosted a virtual workshop with Kamilah Clayton, open to all OSSTF/FEESO members, exploring how self-care and well-being can be centered in equity work.
